Indianapolis Aug. 2nd. 1845.

The Council convened in Stated meeting, Present Joseph A. Levy President, Messrs. Montague, Goldsberry, Nowland, Louden, Griffith & Vanblaricum, concilmen.

The Report of the Treasurer, and ..eighmaster, were respectively presented, read and received.

Mr. Vanblaricum, chairman of the Committee appointed at the last regular Meeting to confer with the Town Engineer, on the Subject of Surveys for water privileges, presented the following Report, to wit, "Pogaes Run where it crosses Market Street, is 7 feet 9 Inches lower than the centre of Meridian Street, South of Circle: 8 Feet 3 inches lower than the top of the well on Pennsylvania Street, 6 feet 8 inches lower than the well on Meridian Street, and 3 feet 9 inches lower than the well on Kentucky Street.

The bottom of the Canal, above the lock at the paper Mill is 7 feet li inches lower than the centre of Meridian Street, South of Circle.

On the application of Sundry citizens of the Second and thirds Wards in Indianapolis, It is Ordered, - That the councilmen of Said Wards, shall be and they are hereby authorized to superintend the grading of Delaware street, from its intersection with Maryland Street, to so far South of the crossing of South Street, as may make a convenient grade to South Street, - And also the grading of Pennsylvania Street, in the Same way, as well as also South Street, on each Side of the Depot Location, on said Streets in Said Wards, so conforming such connection of South Street with the Depot, as to make access to the Same convenient; -- All such grading to be at the expense of Such citizens, as may choose to aid in the Same, except the necessary Oversignt and Surveying, and any work Such Councilmen may bestow thereon, and any appropriation the Council may at any time, make in aid of Such grading.

The President laid before the Council, the following petition to wit, "To the President and Council of the Town of Indianapolis

The undersigned owners of property through which Pogues Run passes, in part of the Town of Indianapolis, considering that by making the run Straight, or as nearly so as may be practicable, between its diverging from Washington Street, to or near the centre of the Town, its overflow would be prevented, respectfully represent, that we will make the Run, as straight as practicable, through the property we respectively own, and levee the banks thereof, if necessary; if the public will do the Same, and construct the Bridge across the Streets crossing the Run, when straightend; And that the proper line may be determined, and the proper action had, whatever it may be, and whomever by, we request that you will direct the Survey, and establishment of the route for such Straitening of the Run, between the above Points, and that the levels of the line may be correctedly ascertained."
