

Council Chamber
Indianapolis March 31st 1846.

The Council met. Present Joseph A. Levy, President elect for the ensuing year. (to whom the usual Oath of Office was administered by James G. Jordan J. P.) Messrs. Goldsberry, Louden & Vanblaricum, Councilmen. Absent Mr. Montague.

Mr. Abram W. Harrison, Councilman elect for the third Ward, for the term of two years, and Mr. Charles W. Cady, Councilman elect for the fifth Ward for the term of two years, presented their certificates of election, and after the usual Oath of Office having been administered to Mr. Cady, and an affirmation to Mr. Harrison, took their seats as Members of the Council.

On Motion of Mr. Louden, the Council proceeded to the appointment of Secretary of the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis for the term of One Year.

Whereupon, James G. Jordan, was appointed Secretary of the Common Council, having received the unanimous vote of the Members of the Council present (6)

The President laid before the Council the Bond of Jacob B. Fidler as Marshal elect of the town of Indianapolis for the ensuing year.

Whereupon, the Same was accepted and Mr. Fidler being present, the President administered to him the usual Oath of Office.

And the Council adjourned to meet on Saturday the 4th day of April next at 2 o'clock P. M.
