The a/c of P. F. Neuland amounting to \$13.25 for additional compensation for making Bridges was presented, & on Mo unconditionally rejected.

Mr. Goldsberry, presented the petition of Sundry citizens of the 1st & 2nd wards asking the Council to cause a certain extensive Mud hole situate on Alabama Street to be abated as a nuisance, Read & referred to Committee on Streets & alleys.

Mr. Cady presented the following Resolution towit.

Resolved. That from and after the 1st day of December A.D.1846. until the 31st day of March 1847, both inclusive, the stated market day at the East Market on Wednesday, shall be held at 10 o'clock A.M; and the Stated Market day at the West Market on Friday, shall be held at 10 o'clock A. M. Not adopted.

Mr. Goldsberry, moved an appropriation for the purpose of completing the grade of Pennsylvania Street at its intersection with South Street commenced by the Rail Road Co.- Upon the question shall an appropriation be made, the ayes & nays were demanded by Mr. Cady. Those who voted affirmatively were Messrs. Montague & Goldsberry - 2. Those who voted negatively were Messrs Louden, Cady & Mr. President - 3. So said appropriation failed.

On Mo of Mr. Louden

Resolved, That the stated sessions of the Council shall be held on the first Saturday of each month, at half past six o'clock P.M. until otherwise ordered.

On Motion of Mr. Cady

Resolved, That the Marshall be and he is hereby directed to remove all loose dirt, filth, and other obstructions from Washington Street during the ensuing week, and that in all cases when he cannot enforce the provisions of the Ordinance in regard to nuisances, against personal offenders, he shall remove the same without unnecessary delay, and in strict conformity with the Ordinance now in force.

And the Council adjourned.
