Council met pursuant to adjournment, Present a full Council.

On Mo Mr. VanBlaricum

Resolved That the committee on streets etc. be directed to examine the Bridge across the Canal on the Michigan Road and instruct the Supervisor to make such repairs as may be deemed by them necessary.

Ordered - That the Supervisor, under the direction of the Committee on Streets etc. be instructed to cause Kentucky avenue, immediately west of the canal, to be repaired, and report the expense thereof at the next regular meeting of the Council.

On Mo of Mr. Harrison. Resolved. That the attorneys for the corporation be directed to bring suits in cases of violations of the act of incorporation, and of any of the Ordinances, when in their opinion suits ought to be grought, and more particularly for Offences by the sale of Spirituous liquors, by the small, gambling, and licentiousness,

On the amendment to chapter IX of the Ordinance on the subject of Nuisances, was taken from the table, and on the question, "Shall the amendment be adopted, the ayes & nays were demanded by Messrs Montague & Van Blaricum. Thos who voted affirmatively were Messrs Goldsberry, Harrison, Louden & the President - 4. Those who voted negatively were Messrs. Montague & VanBlaricum - 2. Not voting, Mr. Cady - 1. So said amendment was adopted to take effect from and after its publication in the Indiana State Journal & Indiana State Sentinel.

Ordered, That the Secretary be and he is hereby authorized and directed to procure a suitable Blank Book in which to record the proceedings of the Common Council.

And the Council adjourned.
