Mr Cady presented the petition of Isaac Blackford & others, in relation to the grading, graveling & paving the sidewalks, on both sides of Meridian Street, between Circle Street and Indianal Street, and praying also that the petitioners be exempted from the provisions of the ordinance requiring shade trees to be on the outer edge or line of the Sidewalks, And that the Shade trees already planted on said sidewalks be permitted to remain &c.

The petition being read

It was Ordered, That the prayer of the petitioners be granted and that the city engineer make survey, and establish grade marks for the improvement desired, and notify the Street commissioner thereof as required by the provisions of Ordinance No 2 of the city council adopted June 21. 1847.

The following petition was presented towit



Ordered That the Marshall cause a window to be made on the east side of the council chamber, of the same size as those on the North side of the chamber.

Ordered That the commissioner of Streets be directed and empowered to sell the pumps, stacks, on the corner of Pennsylvania & Ohio Streets to the best advantage, and pay the proceeds thereof to the city Treasurer.

On Motion of Mr King The council proceeded to the election of a councilman for the Sixth ward, whereupon, on the fifth call Morris Morris, was duly elected councilman for said ward to serve until the next election for councilmen.

Ordered That the Secretary inform Mr Morris of his election.

On Motion of Mr Cady Resolved. That the Board of Health be requested to report to the council such rules and regulations for their government as they may deem proper.

And the council adjouned.
