The President laid before the council a communication from the Treasurer for the Marion Fire Engine Co. demanding all the back rents received by the council for the use of the South room of the Second Story of the Engine house. or council House. which communication, or demand, was read and laid upon the Table.

Ordered That the commissioner of Streets be directed to notify C Coleman to replace the Pump on Washington Street opposite the Branch Bank to its Original place within Twelve days from the reception of the notice, and in default of said Coleman so to replace said pump as aforesaid, that the commissioner proceed to replace the same at the expense of said Coleman.

On Motion of Mr Wingate, Resolved That the city council accept the draft of \$100. presented to them this evening by Mr Thomas D Gregg, for the purpose of aiding in the erection of suitable school houses for Free Schools in this city, and that they hereby tender on behalf of said city to Mr Gregg their thanks for his very liberal donation.

Ordered That the Secretary have the foregoing resolution published in the Indiana State Journal & Indiana State Sentinel.

Mr King presented the petition of sundry citizens praying the privilege to use four feet of the Outer edge of the pavements on Washington Street. for Salt Barrels which was read, and rejected.

On motion of ~~the President~~

Resolved. That the city council hereby direct the President to draft and present to the General Assembly now in session a Petition asking the enactment of a law authorizing the city council of Indpls to levy a special cash Tax on the assessment List of said city return by the Assessor for the year 1847. not exceeding ten cents on the hundred dollars for the purchase of a Fire Engine, and other necessary Fire Apparatus for the use of said city which Tax shall be made payable within thirty days after notice given thereof.



Resolved further, That inasmuch as the State has a large amount of real property within the city limits exposed to destruction by fire the General Assembly be also petitioned to grant a sum of money to aid in the purposes aforesaid exceeding one fourth of the amount raised by said special tax, which amount shall be certified under oath by the Secretary of the city council.

Mr Gates, presented the Petition of sundry citizens of the 1st Ward requesting an appropriation of Ten dollars to the grading and raising Noble Street at the Point of New York Street. provided the same amount be subscribed by those interested in said grading.

The petition being read, it was not granted.

And on Motion the council adjourned.

Indianapolis Jany 24. 1848

The council met upon a call. Present Chas W. Cady President Messrs Gates, Tutewiler, King & Rooker, Councilmen.

The object of the meeting having been explained by the President.

The following minute & Order were presented & adopted towit.

Whereas, by an Act of the Legislature of 9<sup>th</sup> Feby 1831. the agent of State for the Town of Indianapolis, was directed to make an accurate survey of the lands around said Town. &c. according to the plat presented to the Legislature by said Agent, and to cause to be made out two complete maps or plats of the town designating the names & width of the Streets & alleys &c. to deposit one of said maps in the Office of the Recorder of Marion County and that from that time "it shall be considered a public Record, which map was subsequently on the day of July 1831. deposited in said office.

Portions of several of the streets & alleys upon the outskirts of the Town has been inclosed by the Owners of property adjacent thereto, simply for their own present convenience, and not at all with a view of vacating them.
