The Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present a full council, Messrs Tutewiler & Eaglesfield. excepted.

The principal Object of the meeting being to hear and determine appeals from the Assessment, returned by the City Assessor for the year 1848. Appeals were taken by R B Duncan, H. Ohr for E Slyfer. Thomas H Sharpe for David Eckert. Isaac Coe, and corrections were made in the discretion of the Council.

Ordered, That the President & Mr Mayhew constitute a committee with whom the Secretary may confer, in relation to Any Matters in the Assessement. coming under his notice requiring correction.

Ordered. That the returns of the recent election to provide for the purchase of a Fire Engine. be filed.

686.687 Allowed, William Fletcher \$24.00 in full of an apc for \$27.00 for repairs of Public Wells.

689 Allowed J. J. Wiseman \$1.87\frac{1}{2} Articles furnished for the corporation.

688 Allowed, Phillip Socks \$11.25 for labor &c. in Public Burying Ground.

Ordered. That the President be a committee to have sign Boards painted designating the principal Streets and to cause them to be affixed to the respective corners of the same between the limits of Tennessee and Delaware Streets east & west, inclusive, And on Washington Street.

A petition of Sundry citizens, Owners of Property on the NW. Side of Kentucky Avenue between Washington & Tennessee Streets, asking the passage of an Order for grading and gravelling the sidewalk on Said Avenue between the points aforesaid, was presented, read, and laid upon the table.

Sundry other subjects suggested to the notice of the Council, were without consideration laid over until the next meeting of the Council.

And, On motion the Council adjourned.
