The council met upon a call. Present George A. Chapman President Messrs Alford, Eaglesfield, Mayhew, & Sibert of the council.

The proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Petition of citizens, owners of property on the N.W. side of Kentucky Avenue between Washington & Tennesse Streets, asking privilege to Grade and Gravel the side walk on said Avenue between the points aforesaid, which petition was presented to the council at their last meeting, and laid upon the table, was on Motion taken from the Table, Whereupon It was.-

Ordered, That the prayer of the Petitioners be granted, - that the city Engineer, make survey - establish. grade marks for said improvement. and notify the commissioner of Streets thereof as required by the Ordinance regulating the grades of Streets &c.

Ordered That the new course of Pogues run now being excavated through Block No 96. be extended across South Street, and at a cost not exceeding ten cents per cubic yard. And that the earth excavated by said new course on said street, be Applied to the filling up of the old course of said run on said street, said work to be performed under the superintendance of the Commissioner of Streets --

Ordered That Washington Street between the canal, and West Street be suitably repaired at the lowest possible expense, under the direction of the Committee of Streets

On motion of Mr Mayhew. Resolved. That the Secretary give notice fer that sealed proposals will be received at his Office until the 9th inst. for the construction of a culvert across Washington Street at the intersection of New Jersey Street, and for excavating a Ditch on West side of New Jersey Street south of Washington

Ordered That the Order adopted August 21. 1847. for the grading and gravelling of the Side walks on both side of Meridian Street from the Circle to North Street, be and the same is hereby renewed.

The President laid before the Council the following petition viz.

"To the Honorable, the City council of the City of Indianapolis County of Marion and State of Indiana.



The undersigned Benjamin I. Blythe Owner of One hundred feet of Ground on the west side of Delaware Street, commencing at a point 75 feet south of the South side of South Street, thence running south 100 feet along said Delaware Street; And the undersigned Robert B. Duncan Owner of 195 feet of Ground on the East side of said Delaware Street, commencing at South Street and running back to an Alley 195 feet te-an-alley along Delaware Street.
