Council Chamber Indianapolis July 30th 1850

Council met, Present Messrs McOuat, Louden, Rooker, Landis, Hetselgesson, Eckert & Mr. President.

The President stated the object of the meeting to be, the examination of the Assesment as made by the assessor for the year 1850, and fixing the amount of Taxes for said year.

The Assessor then laid before the Council the assessment as made out by him for the year 1850, which was examined by the Council, and on motion was Received by them.

On motion of Mr Eckert, the Council assessed the sum of fifteen cents on each one Hundred Dollars worth of property for general purposes, for the year 1850

On motion of Mr Landis, the sum of One Dollar as a poll tax, shall be assessed on each male person of the age of Twenty one years and over for the present year.

On Motion of Mr Louden, the sum of One Dollar was assessed against every person residing within the limits of the Corporation, for each and every species of Dogs owned by them.

On Motion of Mr Louden, the sum of twelve & one half cents was assessed on each one hundred dollars worth of property for School purposes for the present year.

Ordered, That L. M. Vance be permitted to take surplus dirt from the alley between Out Lots numbered

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71 & 72, to complete the fill of the side walk on the South side of Washington Street, East of Pogues Run Bridge opposite Out Lots 79 & 80. Provided said alley shall not be reduced below its proper grade.

The following Report was Read and approved of by the Council.

The Committee consisting of the Councilmen of the 5th & 6th Wards to whom was intrusted the contracting for a Bridge across Pogues Run on Illinois Street, Report that said bridge has been completed according to contract and accepted by the Committee, who had it examined by competant persons. They have also ordered the Secretary to issue the amount of Scrip for the same, all of which they ask the Council to confirm.

The Committee appointed to examine the petition of Henry Buscher, Reported the same back to the Council, and reccommeded that the prayor of said petitioner be granted, which was agreed to by the Council.

R. Gasway's bill was presented, and refered to committee on claims.

On motion of Mr Hetselgesson, the Marshall was ordered to notify
