

On Motion of Mr Hetselgesson, The petition presented by Mr Griffith for grading and gravelling the side walk of Square No 96 on Illinois Street was withdrawn.

The Committee appointed to examine the petition of Henry Buscher, Reported the same back to the Council, and reccommeded that the prayor of said petitioner be granted, which was agreed to by the Council.

R. Gasway's bill was presented, and refered to committee on claims.

On motion of Mr Hetselgesson, the Marshall was ordered to notify



the Street sprinklers to have their pump removed from where it now is, to the well in front of the State Bank.

The Committee on the Fire Department reported favorably to an allowance for the Marion Engine Company to procure new hose, and reported the following

Resolution, which was adopted.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding \$400, be appropriated to procure new hose and put the Engine in good repair, Provided that the Marion Engine Company become an Independent Company.

A petition from the property holders on Washington Street, between Illinois and Tennessee Streets, asking permission to grade and gravel the Street between the McAdamized road and the side walks, and that the gutter be thrown next the pavement, which petition was granted. (See page 236 for petition)

A petition signed by a large number of Citizens, asking that Kentucky Avenue be improved, both in the Street and on the side walk, and on motion said petition refered to the Committee on Streets & Alleys.

A petition signed by some hundred Citizens, praying the Council to dispence with the ringing of the bell before the Market can be opened, so that citizens can purchase their marketing at any time, was read, and on motion was referred to the committee on Markets.

A petition from the property holders on New York Street, between Noble & Alabama Streets, asking permission to grade and gravel the street and side walk, under the provisions of the ordinance was read, and on motion was refered to the Committee on Streets.

Mr Hetselgesson offered the following Resolution which was read and adopted.

Resolved, That a Committee be appointed to enquire into the expediancy of reporting an ordinance to reduce the number of hogs running at large in the city, by levying a tax, or by some other plan, to reimburce the treasury for the heavy expence now imposed upon it by removing dead hogs, and to rid the City of the inconvenience to which it is subject by so many hogs running at large.

On motion of Mr McOuat it was Resolved, That three Physicians be appointed to act as a Board of Health, during the months of August and September, whose duty it shall be to ascertain the health of the several wards,

 and report the same to the Mayor weekly: and it shall be the duty of the Mayor to publish the same in the papers elected by the Council

to publish their proceedings in, and that the sexton report all interments in the graveyards to the Mayor weekly, said Resolution was adopted, and Drs. Mears, Dunlap & Mothershead were appointed by the Council said Board of Health.

The following order was offered by Mr McOaat and adopted.

Ordered, That the Marshall and Street Commissioner proceed forthwith to fill or drain all mud holes, were practicable, where water is standing and stagnating; and to use lime freely and cause if to be used by any and all families. And also cause them to clean their premises so as to add to the health of the City as much as possible, also to to clean the Streets and Alleys of all rubbish.

The following Resolution was Read and adopted.

Resolved, That in view of the application of Messrs Sheets & Defreese on the subject of lighting the City with Gass, a Committee be appointed, to arrange the terms on which the same may be carried into effect, and report the same at the next meeting of the Council, Messrs Eckert, McOuat and Hetselgessor were appointed said Committee.

The following Resolution was read and refered to a select Committee.

Resolved, That a Committee be appointed to take into consideration the expediency of drafting an ordinance requireing all persons owning property within the limits of the old Corporation, to put out and protect ornimental shade trees in front of their respective property, Messrs Rooker, Louden and Eckert were appointed said Committee.

The following Report was received from Mr Cully President of the Council and concured in by them.

The undersigned entrusted with superintending repairs on the Council Chamber, would Respectfully report, That the repairs thus far amount to the sum of Sixty three \$63 and 87 cents, to wit,
