Your committee to whom was referred the petition of Jeremiah Shea Submit the following.


That we have made the necessary examination, at or near the junction of Water Street with White river, and find a great Superabundance of gravel, and from the peculiar and Singular, natural arrangements of the locality your committee are of the opinion that no injurious Consequences could result from the removal of four or five thousand yards as the current at that point will evantually replace it. Your committee are of the opinion, that with careful management, this gravel bar may

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may be made a Source of no inconsiderable revenue to the City. therefore we would recommend that the Mayor be directed to contract with Jeremiah Shea, granting him permission to remove from the point above named Such gravel as he may require at ten cents per yard.

Whereas at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis held on the Sixteenth day of October 1858. a resolution was adopted by Said Council, authorizing the filling up of the Indiania Central Canal within the corpo-

rate limits of said City.

Now therefore, it is agreed on the part of the Terre haute and Richmond Rail Road Company by request and permission of the City Council of Indianapolis to construct an earth embankment at their own expense, across Said Indiania Central Canal where Kentuckey avenue crosses the Same. the width of Said embankment to be not less than Forty five feet (45) at the top of the embankment and it is further agreed on the part of Said Terrehaute and Richmond Rail Road Company if at any time within two years the city authorities are required to remove Said embankment, then Said Rail Road Company promise and agree to remove the Same, or what ever earth they had placed there, free of charge to the City of Indianapolis and it is further agreed by the parties that the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis through and by their Committee promise and agree to protect Said Terre haute and Richmond Rail Road Company from all expense and litigation.

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
