Section 1st Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis that the gutters on Meridian Street, between Washington and Louisiania Streets Shall be properly graded and paved with good boulder Stones Six feet in width, except the crossings of Streets, which Shall be twelve feet in width, and the crossings of alleys which Shall be ten feet in width. The curbing of Said gutters Shall be of good Oak plank 12 inches in width and not less than 4 inches in thickness, and that the expense of grading and paving Such gutters as aforesaid &c.

Mr. North offered the following amendment to the above Ordinance which was read and adopted.

An Ordinance to provide for the grading paving and curbing of the gutters on Meridian Street, between Washington and Louisania Streets inclusive of the West Sidewalk.

Section lst.
