MESSAGES AND PAPERS FROM THE COMMON COUNCIL.

The following message was read and received:

To the President and Members of the Board of Aldermen:

Gentlemen:—I submit herewith the following papers for your consideration, favorably passed upon by the Common Council, at its special session, held September 14th, 1886.

The report from the Committee on Contracts (see pages 796 and 797, *ante*), was read and the favorable action of the Common Council thereon concurred in.

The report of the City Civil Engineer, submitting certain contracts and bonds (see pages 795 and 796, *ante*), was read, and concurrently approved.

The contract and bond of Geo. W. Buchanan, for grading and paving Davis street (see page 797, *ante*), was read and concurrently approved.

The contract of Fulmer & Seibert, for constructing a brick sewer in and along Delaware street, (see page 797, *ante*), was read, and concurrently approved.

The following motions (see pages 797 and 798, *ante*), were read, and concurrently adopted:

That the contractor receiving the contract for building the north Delaware street sewer, be required to furnish a bond to keep in repair the wooden pavement over said sewer for the period of one year, and the pavement at the end of the year to be in satisfactory condition to the City Civil Engineer.

3 That the Special Fire Committee, and the Committee on Water, be, and they are hereby, instructed to cause north Meridian, Seventh and Alabama streets, where not already done, from Washington street to the Exposition Building, to be sprinkled on next Saturday evening, for the convenience and comfort of the Labor Demonstration procession to take place in this city on the next day, and that the work be done, as far as practicable, by the Fire Department.

On motion, the Board of Aldermen then adjourned.
