Mr Nelson moved that William Wood be allowed the balance due him for building the Cisterns in the 1st & 3d wards, and the City Clerk be instructed to issue warrants therefor upon presentation to him of a certificiate from the Civil Engineer

An account of Caleb Scudder for issuing Licenses, was on motion of Mr Nelson referred to the Committee on Accounts

Mr Jones from a Select Committee reported in favor of allowing E Thomson eighteen dollars for his attendance on a Small pox patient at the Galt House

On motion said report was concurred in

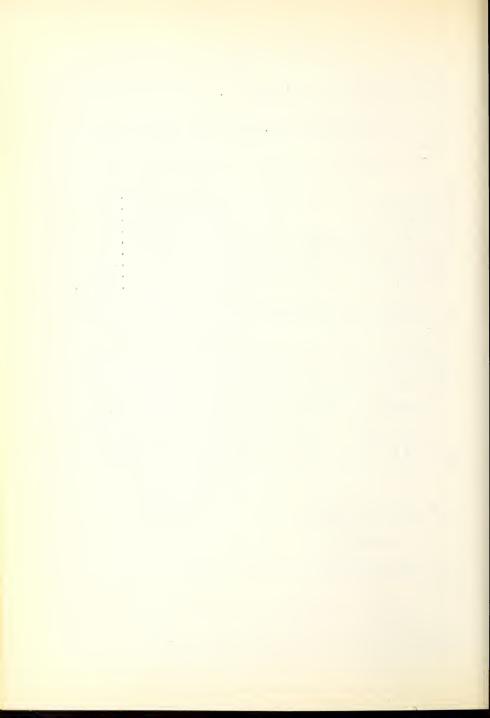
Mr Jones from a Select Committee reported against allowing the account of Mr Minick

By consent of the Council further time was given

A petition was presented from property holders in the neighborhood of Rockwood & Farnsworth Rail Road Car factory asking the Council to have the streets repaired



On motion of Mr Maquire said petition was referred to the Civil Engineer and the City Attorney

Mr Dunlap moved That the vote on the resolution authorizing the City Clerk to issue warrants to Messrs Athon & Elliott be reconsidered

Which motion prevailed

On motion of Mr Dunlap all of said resolution after the resolving clause was stricken out and the following amendment

was inserted.

Into the Treasurer of the City be authorized to pay to James S Athon & Thomas B Elliott \$1076.25, and to issue three warrants in favor of the aforesaid Athon & Elliott for the deferred payments on the property purchased for Hospital purposes, to wit, one for \$1076.25 due July 1 1855, one for \$1076.25 due Jany 1 1856 - and one for \$1076.25 due July 1st 1856, all of which notes to bear interest from the 1st Jany 1855

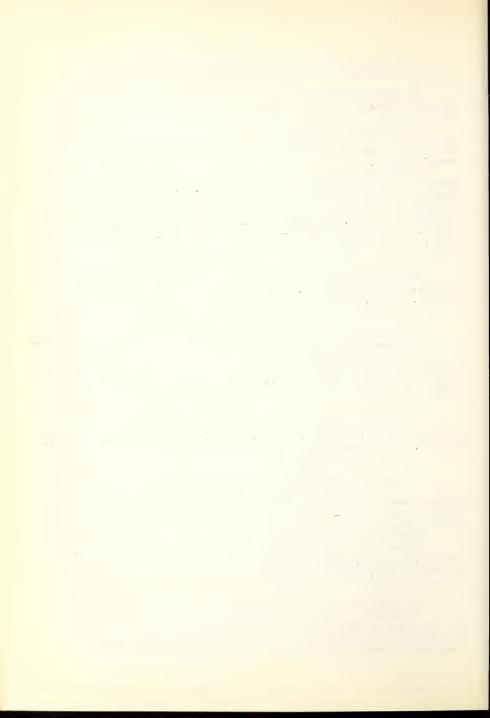

Mr Nelson moved to amend by adding "at the expense of the property holders."

Mr Maguire moved That the City Attorney be authorized to assign a Judgment in favor of the City against Albert E Jones on Esq Fishers Docket, to George McOuat, on payment of same & costs by said McOuat, to the said Attorney, without recourse

Which motion prevailed

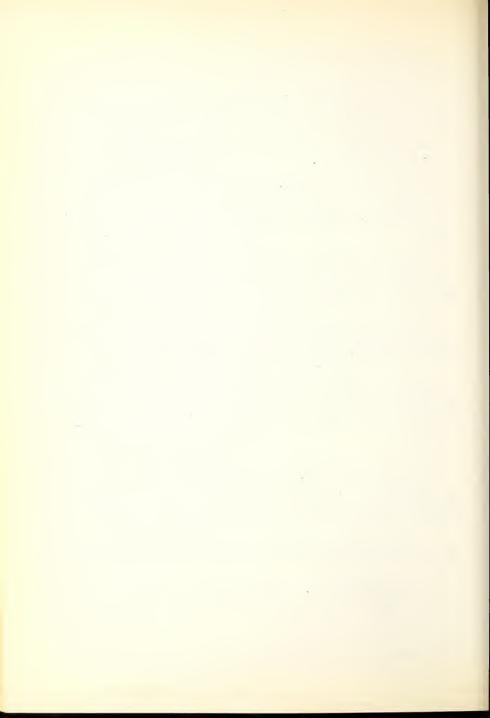

On motion said resolution was referred to the Judiciary Committee with instruction to report an Ordinance in relation thereto

Mr Nelson moved That Alexander Wood be allowed \$200 for eight months service as Assistant Engineer from Sep 1 1853 to May 1 1854

On motion of Mr Jones the estimate for a bridge across the



canal on Georgia Street was taken from the table; and the Civil Engineer was instructed to advertise for proposals to build said bridge

On motion of Mr Pitts the Civil Engineer was instructed to advertise for proposals to build a bridge across the canal on Vermont Street and also for a bridge across Pogues Run on Noble Street

On motion of Mr Nelson the contract with the Gas Company was recommitted to the Judiciary Committee without instructions

Mr Colley offered the following resolution
Resolved That the Judiciary Committee be requested to
report an amendment to the Watch Ordinance so as to require
the Watchman to go on duty at dark each evening and remain
on duty untill day light next morning of each day, and also
provide for paying said Watchman one dollar and seventy five
cents for each day so served by them under said amendment.

Mr Pitts moved to amend by saying "two dollars"

Mr Dunlap moved That said resolution be laid upon the table

Which motion prevailed by the following vote
