The Board of Health would respectfully submit: that during the past summer the health has been unusually good till within the few past weeks. There is at present considerable Ague and Remittent Fever prevailing. The condition of the Central Canal the Board consider highly deletireous to the health of our Citisens, and would suggest that unless the water be turned in again till the season for the prevailing disease be over, the sickness must greatly increase and assume a much more fatal character.
