O. 36, 1887—An ordinance to amend Sections 1, 11, 12 and 14, of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance authorizing corporations, firms, companies or individuals, to lay and maintain pipes in the streets, alleys, avenues, lanes and public grounds in the City of Indianapolis, for the purpose of supplying said city and its inhabitants with natural gas, for heating and illuminating purposes;" ordained and established June 27, 1887.

That the Street Commissioner at once clean the alley running between Georgia and Benton and Concordia and Bates streets, and repair the same.

Councilman Dell offered the following motion; which was referred to the Board of Public Improvements:

That the Street Commissioner be instructed to place foot bridges on Concordia street, at the crossing of Georgia street.

Councilman Mack offered the following motion; which was adopted:

That the Committee on Sewers be instructed to report at the next meeting on the motion referred to it in regard to a sewer pipe to be laid along Hill street, from Union street to Meridian street.

Councilman Pearson offered the following motion; which was adopted:

That John G. Pendergast be granted the privilege of re-laying his sidewalk with brick in front of his property, No 413 north Tennessee street, at his own expense, under the direction of the City Civil Engineer.

Councilman Reinecke offered the following motion; which was referred to the Board of Public Improvements and Street Commissioner, with power to act:

That the Street Commissioner be directed to clean the gutters in Bradshaw street; also, fill up the chuck-holes at the crossing of Holmes and Bradshaw streets.

Councilman Smith offered the following motion; which was adopted:

That Charles Millard and others, be, and are hereby, granted permission to lay a twelve inch sewer pipe in and along St. Mary street, from Delaware street to the first alley east of Delaware street; thence in and along said alley north to and connecting with the Second street sewer. Work to be done at their own expense, under the direction of the City Civil Engineer.

Councilman Stuckmeyer offered the following motion; which was referred to the Board of Public Improvements:

That the Street Commissioner be, and is hereby, instructed to lay a double stone crossing across Virginia avenue, at the intersection of Buchanan street.

Councilman Thalman offered the following motion; which was adopted:

That the C., I., St. L. & C. R. R. Co. be notified by the Street Commissioner to at once remove the trestle bent from Geisendorff street.

Councilman Waterman offered the following motion; which was adopted;

That Philip Reichwein be, and is hereby, granted permission to lay a twelve inch sewer pipe in and along Noble street, from the first alley south of Market street to and connecting with the Pogue's Run branch of Washington street sewer. Work to be done at his own expense, under the direction of the City Civil Engineer.

On motion, the Common Council then adjourned.
