Typewritten papers, doublespaced, with notes and citations on separate pages, also doublespaced, should be submitted in duplicate, accompanied by a stamped return envelope. Manuscripts should follow MLA form, incorporating footnotes in the text whenever possible. Author's name and address should appear only on a separate title page. These steps facilitate our policy of anonymous manuscript review and the prompt return of unused materials.
