The Wonderfully Foolish Mysterioso Cavellini Festivale, NYC 1982 evolved from accusations that the Cavellini Entourage was secretive about the maestro's activities. In fact, activities were not scheduled so much as they just "sort of happened when they did". Many people are very busy in New York City hustling private commitments, compounded by the European sense of Laissez Faire, particularly regarding the clock.

What really happened: Welcoming Party at airport and small party afterwards, Ray Johnson interview, Carlo Pittore paints Cavellini's portrait, E. F. Higgins III paints Cavellini's body, Opening at Grace Mansion Gallery, Cavellini Performance night at Club Armageddon, Video Session with John Jacobs, Visit to John Evans' Studio, Opening at "The Store Upstairs" in SoHo, "Day at the Office", at Spring St. and West Broadway in Soho, and Dinner at Margarette Goodman and Stanley Shelton's.

Winners of the Cavellini Sticker Contest for most placed (the grand total was 25,000) were:

St. Scarlatina Lust, Alex Torrid Zone Igloo, DisloKate Klammer, Skooter, Turke Le Claire, and Carlo Pittore, who all accompanied Cavellini to Hampshire College in Amherst, Massachusetts, for the Festivale there, the organizer being Fred McKay, Box 1193 AL, Amherst, MA 01002.

Cavellini's visit prompted some heavy discussion about the future of being an art star. Several people risked their jobs—a true sacrifice during Reagonomics, and made themselves completely available for the Festivale. During the two weeks in New York City, Cavellini gave us alot to think about and also made us laugh alot.

- Michael Mollett announces that his famous VW Bus will be distributed in two ways. First, a list of all bus parts will be mailed to artists and others around the world who were previously involved with The Bus Project. These people may select three choices for a part. The parts will not be sold but mailed free of charge. The second mailing will include the part chosen with a label and a list of where the other bus parts have been distributed and to whom. These parts are both sculptural and functional, man-made found objects recycled. As it was created, so it may be destroyed—or is it completed. The distribution of the Bus internationally connects with the forthcoming Olympics as a link to international brotherhood. When the project is complete, Mollett will compile a book documenting all aspects of the 64 VW Bus.
