Sue Ann Robinson of Long Beach, California, has been awarded the Library Council's Annual Award at the National Museum for Women in the Arts in Washington, DC. She will have an exhibition in May 1994 at the Museum of her bookworks.

Since 1989, Claude Closky has appropriated the book as an art object in place of his investigation of language. 11 titles (from 100 - 500 in the edition) include the artist's attempts to push the language as far as it will go into a multiples of classification (alphabetical, numerical and chronological) with a scientific rigor which leads to the absurd. For example, 1000 first numbers classed by alphabetical order (1989), 15 hairs (1990), the 365 days of the year 1991 classed in chronological order (1991), or From A to Z (1991), are just examples of 11 titles.
