This New Year brings a large envelope from Berlin with a black cross painted on it from Ruth Wolf-Rehfeldt. The Rehfeldts have held out in East Berlin before the fall of the Wall, available to all mail artists, greeting the New Year always with wishes for peace. This envelope forbodes dark messages--and this large poster showing Robert Rehfeldt. artist of paintings, visual poetry, mail-art, graphics, objects and video, a citizen of the world, died on 28 September 1993. The sticker on the poster reads: "I am Dead, +28.9.93" and Last Mail should be sent to Ruth Wolf-Rehfeldt, Zitherstr. 15, D-13127 Berlin, Germany. We have lost a true friend, a networker who was bridging all worlds before the word ever came to be used. His joy and zest for living, his love of all things aesthetic and people with the same joy will leave a legacy for us all. We will miss you, Robert, and we pray that Ruth will have the strength and the courage to continue building the bridge. Write to her, tell her how you feel about our loss, for it is the loss for all of us in the mail art network--and in fact, in the world.

Free Personal Deluxe Net Mail Delivery Documentary Catalogue, DNC Book 92 is a limited edition of 500 handmade copies, printed in 1992/93 in Denmark, England, Germany and Tasmania. Photos and text are by the authors Angela & Peter Netmail. These books were handbound, stamped and produced by two ardent networkers, who made an odyssey throughout the world, an odyssey of two networkers who traveled by train, plane, automobile, ship and everything else, picking up mail in one place and delivering it to other mail artists in other locations. An amazing system of registration and delivery records followed them throughout the journey, for this was not a simple trip, but a journey throughout the world. This visual diary of meetings and greetings and departures from one country to another. from one continent to another is a saga that is beautifully documented with journal entries, photographs, artists' stamps, rubberstamps, artistamp sheets, stickers, black and white copy photographs, etc. This hand-made, hand copied book is a major contribution to the networking efforts of mail artists throughout the world, facilitated by these two wandering postmen. It is a strikingly interesting document for the 1990s, one that should be used as a reference for decades to come. Major contemporary art collections should have a copy, available for \$100.00 from Peter and Angel Network, P.O. Box 2644, D32383 Minden, Germany. They frankly are not there right now, but are traveling through the Himalayas, where they are sending out mail art from the highest points in the world. But someone is in Minden to honor your orders for the book. The book will eventually be sent out to all Netmail participants eventually, since the postage is prohibitive. Other networkers can have the book at 30% discount.

Eternal Network: A Mail Art Anthology, edited by Chuck Welch, is an illustrated philosophy and history of mail art with 42 chapters written by leading participants from 16 countries on five continents. Included are 147 photographs of performance events, postcards, stampsheets, posters. col-

lages, artists' books, visual poetry, computer art, mail art zines, copy art, and rubberstamped images. Among six appendices are mail art show listings from 1970 to 1990, an extensive mail art archives and collections appendix, plus numerous listings of mail art magazines and where they can be located. She even went to Mannheim for their "Day of the Banana" at the Landesmuseum for Technik and Arbeiten, and their ongoing exhibit on cooking and nutrition. Even in Bremen, Anna Banana participated an event declaring Germany a Banana Republic. She also attended the Rubber Stamp Fair in Hagen. The great event was in Budapest, where Banana Culture was explored, interviews were taken, and 10 kilos of bananas disappeared in the process of completing the test, everyone having a great time. Gyorgy Galantai at Artpool videotapes the evening, and a good banana time was had by all.

She returned to Vancouver to prepare for the Artistamp Biannual at the Davidson Gallery in Seattle and a great Artistamp Fair in December.
