## Mail Art News

The new **Ray Johnson Award**, a \$2,000 prize honoring outstanding contributions to correspondence or mail art, has gone to **Jörg W. Gronius**, an artist who is now living in Hannover, Germany. The prize is sponsored by Edition Janus of Berlin.

Stamp Art Gallery held during September the following exhibitions: Endre Tot, I am glad if I can stamp; Jim Stephan: Stamps Around the Globe; and Kurt Schwitters: Stamp Drawing 1918-23, a photo copy documentation display of Schwitters' Stamp Drawings during those years at 466 - 8th St., San Francisco, from 2 - 28 September. During November, Ken Friedman Rubber Stamps were featured.

The Stamp Art Gallery has a checklist of Stamp Art Editions, which they have been publishing over the past three years. Included are catalogs of the stamp works of Joseph Beuys, Mike Crane, the Fake Picabia Brothers, S. Gustav Hagglund, Graf Haufer, J.H. One of the editions is *Picasso Gaglione: Tampon Trouvé* containing found stamp prints from the rubber found within a 100-foot area from the Gallery in San Francisco, from 1993 - 1995. The Standard Artist Stamp Catalogue, being the only listing of stamps issued by artists, with extensive information and a picture of nearly every major stamp design. edited by Bugmaster General (Seattle, Washington, PMTTTD Corporation, 1995) is a labor of love by one of the participants in the Artistamp movement. Bugmaster General has produced the equivalent of Scott's in this very select, but important new field of artist production. 
