## **WOMEN'S STUDIO WORKSHOP GRANTS**

Artists' Book Residency Grants. Enables artists to produce a limited edition bookwork at Women's Studio Workshop. For six weeks, selected artists are involved in all aspects of design and production of their new bookworks. On-site housing is provided, but each artist is responsible for her own meals. Grant includes a stipend of \$1,800 for six weeks, materials up to \$450 and access to all studios. Deadline: 15 November.

Artists' Book Production Grants. These awards are for artists working off-site. Designed to assist artists working in their own studios with the publication of smaller scale projects. Funds cover production costs up to \$750 of new bookworks. **Deadline: 15 November.** Application should include a one-page description of project, the medium (a) to be used to print the book, the number of pages, page size, edition size, a structural dummy, materials budget, resume, six to 10 slides of recent work, and a S.A.S.E. for return of materials. The National Museum of Women in the Arts has given the 1997 Library Fellows Award to Jo Going for the publication of *Wild Cranes*, which celebrates the royal birds of the unbound wilderness known for their loud trumpeting call and longevity. It contemplates the relationship between humans and the land that inspires spiritual renewal. Public Space and the Visual Book was taught by Genie Shenk in San Diego and La Jolla. Each participant was asked to produce a page of text and image for a work to be printed in an edition of 500. The goal was to provide a forum for exploring the relation of the individual to public space. A secondary goal was to experience the dynamics of collaboration, since this is a modality in which most decisions about public space are made, or should be made. This project is part of the inSITE97 communication engagement program.

The first two meetings of each session were devoted to the development of text ideas through writing and discussion. Participants responded to a list of questions relating to the concept of public space; then as material was shared in the group context, thematic ideas and definitions gradually emerged. Guidelines for type style and page layout were determined, and each group addressed the issues of paper choice, book and cover design, titles, fonts, and wording.

In four sessions, the participants began with a roll of black and white film for visual investigations, then looking at photographs and discussing how to create pages where text and image functions together artistically and then the finished pages were collected and assembled in the order they were to appear in the book.

5 people participated in this project which culminates on 15 October when the book is presented at the Athenaeum in La Jolla, where copies will be on sale.
