The directors of "Paper and Book Intensive" (PBI) are taking proposals forclasses in all fields for both 1999 and future years.

Paper & Book Intensive, a concentrated working session for practitioners and serious students in conservation, papermaking, and the book arts is going into it's 16th. year. Daily class sessions are combined with discussions, lectures, and shared meals to promote high levels of creative exchange and inspiration both within and among the classes. PBI's program is divided into two four-day sessions, with five instructors and workshops in each. Classes are limited to10-12 participants.

Session I consists of 1/2-day classes, that is, each instructor teaches a morning group and an afternoon group over a four-day period, with each class session lasting three hours and covering the same material for both the morning and the afternoon. Session II will also be four days long, but instructors will meet with only one group of 10-12 participants for the full four days (six hours each day).

Session II will be devoted to workshops whose subject matter demands long periods of uninterrupted work-time, whereas Session I will consist of classes whose concepts or projects lend themselves to shorter work periods with time for thinking or independent work in between.

NEW ZEALAND

In Safe Keeping: Treasures of Special Collections.

An exhibition at the Auckland Central City Library including manuscripts, photographs, historic maps, printed books and ephemera. Included are three illuminated medieval manuscripts from the 15th century, one a richly decorated Missal from France, a 1492 English language printing of Geoffrey Chaucer's The Canterbury Tales, Shakespeare's First Folio (1623), a rare black and white edition of William Blake's Europe: A Prophecy (1794), John Lewin's exceedingly rare Birds of New South Wales (1813). These last four are unique to Special Collections, being the only copies in New Zealand.

Items of New Zealand interest will include the original score and lyrics of Thomas Bracken's God Defend New Zealand, the rare Ko Te Katekihama III, the first work printed in New Zealand (1830), a holograph copy of the Treaty of Waitangi, dated 1840, the Report of the Formation and Establishment of the New Zealand Temperance Society, the first English language work printed in New Zealand (1836), and an issue of The *Auckland Times*, a suppressed newspaper of the 1840s. The exhibition is on the Heritage (2nd) Floor, Auckland Central City Library, from 17 July until 24 October 1998. Hours of opening: 9.30-5.00 pm Monday to Friday; 10.00-4.00 pm.
