Medal of Dishonor 2004. Susan Gold Smith is a Canadian mail artist who has an ongoing peace project (meaning no deadline and regular documentation on peace contributions). One of her other projects is a "nomination for the medal of dishonor" (for inflicting most casualties upon a civilian population). It was inspired by a sculpture of David Smith to mark the awful bombings of the Spanish Republican civilians by the German and Spanish fascist air forces during the Spanish civil war in the 1930's. These bombings (see also Picasso's Guernica) were an "introduction" to more fascist "highlights" of World War II. The Medal of Dishonor 2003 was awarded to George W. Bush by popular network art vote!!! You can now still nominate the candidate for the Medal of Dishonor 2004. Her address is: Susan Smith and Gold, Medal of Dishonor 2004, RR#1, P.O. The Cleveland Public Library has just made accessible a small online exhibition of mail art. Baron's Mail Art Collection is a recent acquisition in the Library's Special Collections. This should lead you to a selection of exhibitions. The mail art exhibition is the newest exhibition and is top on the list at the left of the screen.

Personalized Postage has been sanctioned by the United States Postal Service, which has authorized a private company to sell postage to the people who want to create their own stamps, featuring the kids, the dog, the company logo. Such special issue stamps, sold at a premium, are now done through Stamps.com, a Santa Monica company. All you have to do is choose a photo, upload it to stamps.com, and order it. In about a week, you'll be able to send out mail with stamps bearing that photo to celebrate a birthday, anniversary or whatever.

Allowing the public to personalize stamps would add value to sending materials by mail. Personalized stamps were introduced in Canada in 2001 and have proven very popular. Customers send in a picture and Canada Post reduces it to a sticker that can be placed in a postage stamp that has a blank center. The Picture Post stamps sell for \$1, compared with the 48-cent regular price for stamps. The customer must own the copyright to the picture. In the U.S., the price for a sheet of stamps runs around \$17.00 instead of \$7.40.
