Tania Erlij also participated in Dadakin, new works by Boston Area artists in the spirit of Dada at the Hayden Corridor Gallery, MIT in Cambridge, 13 February - 28 March.

• Cavellini was featured in the September 1981 issue of *Frankfurter Idee* with photos, an interview, etc.

• Romano Peli and Michaela Versari in Mail Art Space at c.d.o. in Parma with their 30th exhibition presented *Mailartspace International* no. 1 with 33 artists from 14 countries participating, and with an exhibition of Italian and foreign artists' periodicals. MAILARTSPACE. International is a review of "discussion" on the phenomenon of mail art, issued for the first time in January 1982 with the works in the mother tongue of each artist. • Textile without Textile is a catalog with the works of 54 participants that was published in an edition of 300 signed and numbered copies produced by Artpool Archive, in Budapest.

Gerald Minkoff appeared on October 30 in Budapest at the Artpool Archive Space with an instant event, What can happen among artists during such a meeting?' The theme was Chinese Chess and instant hexagram.

Artpool also reports that they have received more than 600 contributions from 31 countries for their memorial stamp show. In the catalog, they will reprint the Stamp Art article by Peter Frank, and an essay by the Hungarian art critic, Laszlo Beke. The catalog as the show will appear in April 1982.

Just before Christmas, Julia & Gyorgy Galantai organized an Art-Umbrella-Postcard Show, the basic idea of which was using a printed umbrella postcard which Galantai published in honor of *Umbrella*, this newsletter. The results were documented in a catalog which was sent to all participants. The catalog is one of the treasures in the Umbrella Archive.

They also organized a show on My Art Loves Your Art, which was shown at the Helikon Gallery in Budapest from 16 December - 10 January. • Piermario Ciani is showing his Color Xerox work at the La Galleria dell'Occhio, 267 East 10th St., New York, NY 10009 from 21 March - 15 April. • Henk Fakkeldij in Holland writes to let us know that the deadline for his Cards in Series was 28 February and not April and it will not be exhibited at Wulle Mailart Corridor. • Archive Small Press & Communication of Anne & Guy Schraenen in Antwerp, Belgium write that Aeropus I-score was exhibited at the Avant-Garde Music Week in Bruges. Guy is preparing a new cast of a Aeropus concert-performance to be played in several Belgian towns and perhaps in Holland. In June, it will be broadcast on Belgian radio.

Mail (Art) Stamps exhibition has recently been shown at the Postal Museum in Brussels, for which a handsome catalog was printed.

• Guy Bleus still has 50 microfiche catalogs left, which include 17 fiches of all the contributions in the exhibition received before 11 September 1981 for the mail art exhibition at the Free University of Brussels. • During January, propaganda postcards from thousands of Soviet youth urging an end to the "reckless arms race" were snarling the postal operations at NATO headquarters in Brussels. Since mid-December, NATO received 7 mail sacks bulging with season's greetings and doomsday warnings from Soviet students accusing NATO generals of threatening to blow up the world. It has slowed up the business of NATO, since they have to go through all the mail to look for official business. The wording was the same on all postcards, since the instructions came from a cutout printed in Komsomolskaya Pravda, the official newspaper of the Soviet youth organization Komsomol. The message read:

"The greed of those who benefit from military preparations results in the waste of enormous resources necessary for the construction of schools and hospitals.Today the world is in danger again. No to world holocaust." The children also had the option of sending a clipping showing a Pentagon building labeled "NATO" with cannons and bombs sticking from its roof.

•"Sotto il Segno della Mailart" (20 years of Artistic communication, 1962-1982) edited by Romano Peli and Michaela Versari, is a book on mail art published by Bertani Editore in Italy. It will cost 14,000 Lire and can be ordered as soon as it comes out and Umbrella finds out about it.

• Sincerely, San Francisco was an exhibition of postcard art, organized by Carl Heyward, at Washington, DC's Museum of Temporary Art (MOTA) from 28 January through 28 February 1982. Since San Francisco is internationally recognized as a center for the production and "collection" point of postcards, Diane Best of San Francisco's Postcard Palace curated the exhibition in Washington, with the assistance from MOTA's Janet Schmuckal, Ephebe's Katherine Prior (D.C.), Rene Yanez of Galeria/Studio 24 and graphic artists Tom Bonauro and Peter Brunner. The exhibition was accompanied by a videotape, *Wish you were Here*, produced by Mary Stevens, tracing the postcard as an American

document, its use as a propaganda tool, a document of the evolution of the country, etc. Included in this videotape are 8 Bay Area postcard collectors and producers..
